1805-1881	Mary Seacole is best known for her work as a nurse in the Crimean War,
1867- 1934	Marie Curie became the first woman to win a Nobel Prize. She developed the use of X-rays.
1925- 2013	Margaret Thatcher was the first woman Prime Minister of the U.K.
1997- present	Malala Yousafzai stood up to the Taliban in Pakistan and demanded that girls be allowed to receive an education.
