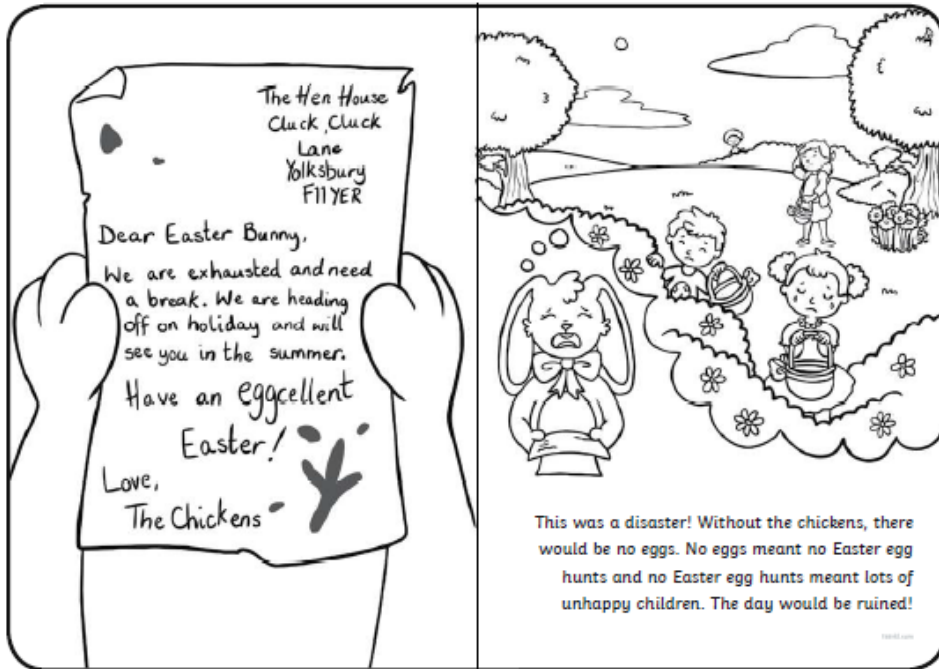


Easter English Activities
