Subject/ Theme	Learning ideas and activities
English/RE/PSHE	Make an Easter acrostic poem - Each line of your poem needs to start with one of the letters from Easter. Choose from different templates for your poem or make more than one! Maybe you could put a poem in your window for people who are walking past.
	Virtual Easter egg hunt! Have a bit of fun and the attached powerpoint to find the hidden eggs! Can you make your own hunt at home? Try writing clues to help other people in your family find the hiding places!
	Use the Holy Week pebble document to talk about Holy Week and share thoughts and prayers together. Can you write a prayer and say it with someone from your family who you are not able to visit at the moment? It could be a prayer to say thank you to people who help us, a prayer for people who are on their own or a prayer for you friends and family.
	Say and learn the Helping at Home prayer. This links in with the Kindness calendar mentioned in last weeks home learning.
	Spelling eggs - using the sheet 'spelling egg's choose words that you need practise to spell and write one in the middle of each egg. Then rewrite the words in the space between the two egg shapes. You could use different colours so you have rainbow eggs.
Maths	Complete the Easter dot-to-dot puzzles. Choose from 1 to 23, 1 to 49/50, 41 to 85 or 90 to 120!
Science, History or Geography	Watch these links to see chicks hatching https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=k3N5vtauDQU
	Using the chicks hatching photos, cut the pictures out and put them in order to show how a chick hatches. Vocab challenge - Can you find out the meaning of the words 'pipping' and 'oviparous'
	and write definitions for them? You can watch what happens day to day to eggs that are in an incubator by watching The Big Hatch on https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC6zRg8NXFs16cpxCkQFf1sg Keep watching to see when the chicks will hatch!
	Find out more about how birds raise their young in this video. https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/class-clips-video/science-ks1-ks2-raising-baby-bird/zrcb47h Can you make a fact file about things you have learnt?
	Look at the Signs of Spring facts and talk about these together. Go outside and look at how things are changing in Spring. What can you feel, hear and see? Complete the Sings of Spring sheet to record what you notice.
