Geography
How do people's homes at Kampong Ayer compare with mine?
 Have a look at the photos of the homes in Kampong Ayer. They look very different to the houses in England because they are built on a river!
 The inside layout of the traditional homes of Kampong Ayer will be different to that of the homes of most children in the United Kingdom, in that they are single storey and reminiscent of a Malay 'long house' design. The inside is often one very long and wide reception room which stretches from the entrance porch and a sitting area to a kitchen, bathroom and toilet at the rear. This distance from front to back can be as much as 20m. On both sides of the long room there are often display cabinets; book cases; photographs on the walls; free standing clothes racks; cupboards with cutlery and crockery etc. At Kampong Ayer the long rooms are boarded with wooden planks and rugs or rattan mats on top. The bedrooms are positioned on both sides of the long room and accessed by doors from it.

Have a look at the scale plan of a house in Kampong Ayer. The plan is clearly smaller than the actual house because it would be useless if it wasn't! Explain that maps are always smaller but accurate representations of places.

Draw a plan of your house, try to make it as accurate as you can! Please e-mail in the plans of your houses, I would love to see your accurate drawing skills.
