Forest School Provision (staffing)	£8,655	To provide pupils with the opportunity to undertake a range of practical activities, in a physically active outdoor environment, helping to promote healthier lifestyles and develop team working skills.	Children have learnt how to handle risk in a safe outdoor area; gross motor skills particularly upper body are developed through climbing; problem solving and team work promoted through collaborative tasks such as den building & orienteering. Additional equipment and resources have allowed the children to develop outdoor cooking skills and increase understanding of healthy choices and safety.	
Sports Partnership Sports Co-ordinator	£2155	To deploy a specialist teacher to train existing teachers across a cluster of schools and promote and encourage to competitive sport.	Our contribution to the Bury Sports Partnership has enabled a sports coordinator to continue to organise a wider range of competitive sporting events for our pupils to take part in. This has encouraged more children to enter competitions, join clubs and become more physically active.
