Love— the strong feeling you have when you love someone very much.

Mutual respect— Both parties have respect for one another. For example: you respect me, and in return I respect you back.

Respect— the feeling you have for someone you like or admire.

Rules— something that everyone ought to obey.

Scriptures— the holy writings of a religion, for Christians, the Bible.

The Holy Family— consists of the Child Jesus, the Virgin Mary, and Saint Joseph
