### National Curriculum Aims

### Key Vocabulary

Roman numerals	A number system used by ancient Romans. They used different capital letters for ones, tens, hundreds and thousands and had no symbol for 0.
Place value	The position or place of a digit in a number.
Thousands (Th)	The ordinal number of 1000.
Hundreds (H)	The ordinal number of a hundred.
Tens (T)	The ordinal number of a ten.
Ones (O)	Means one.
More	Where one quantity is greater than another quantity.
Less	Where one quantity is smaller than another quantity.




