Dear family and friends of St Joseph's school, welcome back to a new school year. We have been blessed with the most glorious start to the term, weather-wise and in welcoming 23 wonderful children into our reception class. I have been so impressed at how quickly they have settled in and become members of our St Joe's family.

I would like to thank you all for the generous gifts at the end of last term and for the kind words and cards that I and staff received. We all believe we have the best and most rewarding job in the world, but knowing we are appreciated is like the cherry on top.

At St Joe's we never stand still and this year we are continuing to develop reading and spelling using Soundswrite, AR reader and a new diagnostic spelling test to follow soon. We have also launched a new handwriting scheme across the school. There will be a parent's workshop presented by Mr LS to explain why we have chosen this scheme and the benefits.

Please don't forget to come along to the class welcome meeting. We have listened to parent's concerns about being able to attend multiple presentations so have spread them across the week, the dates of each year group are listed in the diary date section of this newsletter.

We are continuing our strong links with our Parish, Our Lady and St John the Evangelist at the Croft. Thank you to all the parents who attended the postponed summer fayre last Saturday evening. I know that Father Brett was pleased so many people attended and it was such a relaxed and friendly community occasion.

The children will attend Mass once a half term in church and we have two whole school Masses planned for this term. After a whole school Mass, we have refreshments which is an excellent opportunity to get to know other parents and people in our parish.

On Tuesday the whole school had an assembly about democracy and how important it is for pupils to have a voice and contribute to the life of the school, which builds strong and respectful communities. On Thursday we had hustings and voted for this years House Captains. Every child listened intently to the presentations, asked questions and then voted with the counter they were given. The results were close, reflecting how seriously the children engaged with the process.

I feel as though we are still slowly waking up, after being negatively impacted by Covid lockdowns and restrictions. Previously, parents were involved in coordinating summer and Christmas fayres and other fundraising events for additional school funds. I am not suggesting reinstating these events, because the economic climate has changed and people's working patterns. However, it would be wonderful if people could come along to the volunteer afternoons this term. They will

Well done to all the children who joined the Suffolk library's reading summer challenge. So far, I have been given 32 certificates to present at Friday's celebration assembly. As a school we are very proud of our reading attainment and this year 95% of children in year 6 reached the expected level in their reading SATs paper, compared to the National figure of 73%. We recognise this is a shared, home - school achievement. Reading is so important as it involves comprehension to process the words you read. Beyond that, you can use your analytical abilities, stimulate memories, and even broaden your imagination. Reading is a neurobiological process that works out your brain muscles.

Please keep encouraging your child/ren to read, it impacts every area of the curriculum.
