Robins Class were introduced to their new Sound board this week. This is officially known as a resonance board which acts like a big drum, amplifying sounds and vibrations which can then be heard and felt. It is a great tool for developing communication, vocalisation and speech, anticipation, rhythm and turn taking. It was met with great excitement and the children came to explore the board, checking



it out and feeling the vibrations through their bodies. They watched and listened and some of them began to try joining in with the songs in whatever way felt right for them.
